THE NATIONAL ENDOWMENT FOR THE ARTS SHORT FILM SHOWCASE ROUND V - a program for the distribution of short films to commercial theatres, administered by the Foundation for Independent Video and Film (FIVF), is accepting films completed in 16mm or 35mm, have running times of ten minutes or less, not already in 35mm theatrical distribution, and qualify for an MPAA rating of G or PG. Each film-maker whose work is selected will receive an honorarium of \$3,000 and will super vise the 35mm blow-up of his or her film. To be eligible, filmmaker must be an American citizen or permanent resident, control the US theatrical rights to film, and have cleared all performance rights. Up to 3 films may be submitted.
